





The Children's Hearing Institute granted \$25,000 to Hearing Health Foundation for Pediatric Research



Grant Update 2018-2019

In early 2018, CHI supported the Hearing Health Foundation's (HHF) Emerging Research Grant program

in support of pediatric research. CHI's grant was awarded to Babak Vazifehkhahghaffari, PhD, at Washington University in St. Louis. His research focused on "Enhancing cochlear implant performance through development of improved auditory nerve fiber biophysical models with a combined wet lab and dry lab approach." The goal of this project is to improve success with cochlear implants, such as understanding of speech in noise and perceiving pitch and music, by combining models of electric field potential with biophysical models of auditory nerve fibers, and to better understand hearing loss mechanisms by detailing the anatomy and electrophysiology of inner ear sensory hair cells.

"CHI remains dedicated to supporting innovative research that will benefit children with hearing loss. We are excited to be funding ground breaking research through HHF's ERG Program and look forward to hearing more about his progress," *said Melissa Willis, Executive Director of CHI.*
